Year 5/6 were so inspired and have started thinking of ways to help fundraise towards their new prayer baskets.

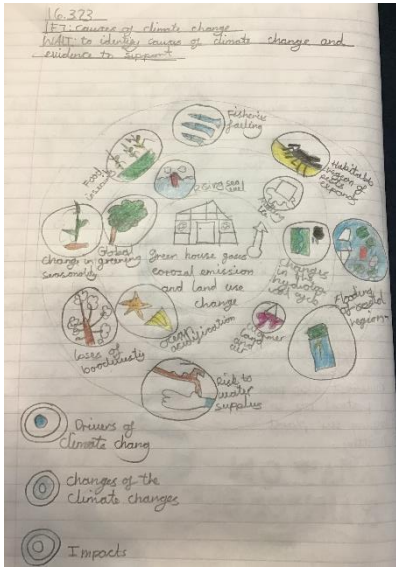
French:
