Question: What I would like to see further improved about Collective Worship in St. George's Catholic Primary School. (12 Responses)

You said ...	So we ...
Last time I attended year 5/6 classroom meeting I noticed the Quran on the window and was confused. Is this being taught as part of collective worship?	Islam is taught as part of the Religious Education curriculum as one of the two non-Christian faiths studied. As part of this learning, children may be introduced to the Qur'an in an age-appropriate way. The Qur'an, like the Bible and a range of other faith-based and prayer books, may be available in the classroom to support children's understanding. These resources are used respectfully and help pupils learn about different beliefs and traditions.
Talks from outside the school to broaden the horizon of young individuals. Interfaith dialogue and withstanding other religious beliefs.	As part of our Religious Education curriculum, children learn about Islam and Judaism alongside Christianity. At St. George's, tolerance and respect are central to our core values, and we believe it is important for children to develop an understanding of different faiths and beliefs in a positive and age-appropriate way. To support this learning, we have previously welcomed visitors into school to share their experiences and, where appropriate, arranged visits to local places of worship. We will continue to provide these valuable opportunities to help children learn about the diverse world around them
More parent involvement	We value parental and carer involvement very highly at St. George's. Throughout the year, parents and carers are already invited into school at various points to help support the children as we celebrate the liturgical year together. As we continue to develop and strengthen our prayer and liturgy provision, we hope to be able to offer an even wider range of opportunities for parents and carers to join us in prayer and worship in the future.
I don't know whether you incorporate modern worship songs like Hillsong or others into collective worship.	At St. George's, we use a wide range of music to support our collective worship, including traditional Catholic hymns as well as more modern worship music from artists such as Kari Jobe, Rend Collective, and others. We are always keen to explore new ideas and would warmly welcome any suggestions from families. If you have particular songs or artists you would like to recommend, we would love to hear from you!
