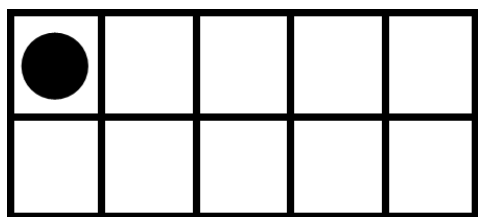
Linked to our half termly topic of 'This is me' we have made finger puppets of people special to us using templates.

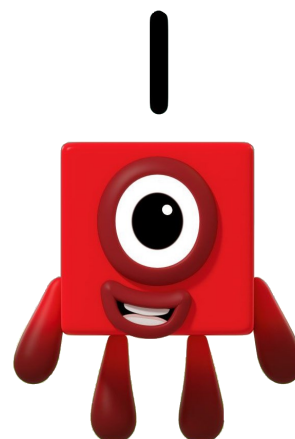


We loved our first PE lesson with Darren—he said we were the best class in the whole school and our listening skills were fantastic!
