
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Other Religions: Judaism

Year 5- Friday (Swimming - first half term only beginning 15th September)


Year 6 - swimming will start after the first half term.

Science:

Autumn 1 - Earth and Space

We will learn to:

- describe the movement of the Earth and other planets relative to the sun in the solar system
- describe the movement of the moon relative to the Earth - describe the sun, Earth and moon as approximately spherical bodies
- use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky



Autumn 2 - Forces

We will learn to:

- explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object
- identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces
- recognise that some mechanisms including levers, pulleys and gears allow a smaller force to have a greater effect


History

Year 5/6 will be focusing on 'Black History Month'.

We will be looking at influential people in black history. We will focus on inspirational quotes and achievements of both historic and modern-day people, with a particular focus on people from the UK.



Geography - Climates around the world



We will learn to:

- describe the link between temperature and the equator.
- know what the climate is like in different climate zones.
- locate the world's largest hot deserts on a map.
- locate the world's major temperate climate zones on a map.
- locate the world's major cold environments on a map.
