Rationale:

All children and families should feel happy and supported moving into a different setting.

Purposes:

- All children to receive support so they can adapt to the changes in the next phase of their learning.
- Transition should include parents/carers so they understand the changes that will occur.

Guidelines:

- Transition will take place during the summer term in Reception.
- Pupils entering Reception from different settings will be invited to attend a new parents meeting as well as a 'Play and Stay' session where they will be able to explore the environment with their family whilst getting to know the staff.
- It is also possible for St George's staff to visit new pupils in their settings to forge new relationships as soon as possible.
- A parents/carers meeting is held for new Early Years (Nursery and Reception) parents/carers during the Summer term where information is shared regarding the start dates and times of the day, teaching and learning objectives, school routines and the expectations and so parents can feel reassured about the year ahead - parents/carers who cannot attend will have the information posted to them.
- Pupils beginning Year 1 also have hourly sessions in their new classroom to explore the environment and get to know the adults they will be working with.
- Information regarding any changes will be shared with parents/carers so they can support their child.

- Information regarding the characteristics of learning is shared between the Reception and Year 1 teachers. This allows the Year 1 staff to plan and prepare an environment that is conducive to learning for all pupils.
- A parents/carers meeting is held for children starting Year 1 during the Autumn term where information is shared regarding the daily timetable, teaching and learning objectives, school routines and the expectations so parents can feel reassured about the year ahead and get to know the Year 1 staff - parents/carers who cannot attend will have the information shared via post or the school website.

This policy is reviewed annually by the SLT/EYFS lead.
