National Numeracy programme

Our school is delighted to have been selected to work with the independent charity 'National Numeracy' on an exciting project which encourages children and families to do maths together. As part of the project, we will be introducing National Numeracy's Family Maths scrapbooks and activities. These are activities that help children and families to explore everyday maths at home and in school together. They link the maths that children are learning at school with life outside the classroom. Families don't need any special knowledge or equipment to work on the activities.
